It was a year of economic crisis, financial turmoil and instability and yet with your support the Central Missouri Food Bank experienced the greatest outpouring of caring and compassion for the hungry than ever before.

Because of you:

- Approximately 90,000 people were fed monthly in central & northeast Missouri.
- The Buddy Pack program grew to 66 schools sending food home with 3,000 children each week.
- 16,891 volunteers donated 46,221 hours of service.

Thanks to the generosity of Columbia Orthopaedic Group the Food Bank's mortgage was paid off.

Through our partnerships with food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters for abused and homeless, senior programs, and low-income children's programs, 21,705,124 pounds of food and related groceries were distributed. ***This is a new record!***

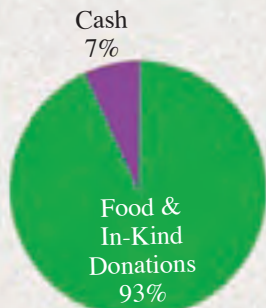

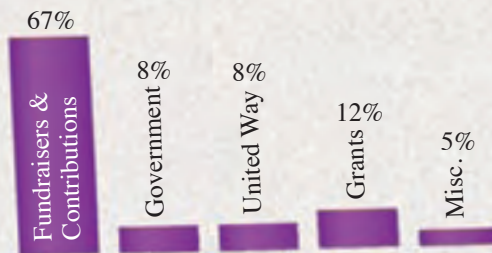

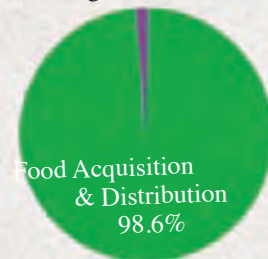
