

# A letter from Lindsay

How we think about hunger is changed forever. For that, I am grateful. After a year of unanticipated challenges and incredible hardship, I hold dearly to that silver lining and the others found along the way. Food insecurity has always been prevalent, but the COVID-19 pandemic created a national discussion on the topic that led to new awareness. The efficiency, reach and impact of food banks is more visible than ever.

2019 saw the lowest national food insecurity rate in 20 years. Now, in 2021, 42 million Americans are expected to experience food insecurity. Last year, people across the country were laid off or lost hours at work. Nearly a million Missourians were food insecure last year, including 115,000 people who did not need help before.

The pandemic brought a storm of need. The Food Bank responded by changing how we provide food so we could continue our mission safely. We added new distribution sites. We worked with schools so nutrition would continue to get to food-insecure students. We partnered with other community organizations to deliver food and provide access to other essentials. To weather the challenge, The Food Bank had to alter how we do everything and identify new funding sources.

You, our donors, volunteers and partners, enabled the success shown in this report. People gave to The Food Bank at record numbers and volunteered as much as possible. But, the support was even more profound than that. People shared information on getting help and supporting each other every day. That seems like a simple thing, but it made it easy and normal for thousands to get help when they needed it.

With no guidebook and no way to predict what would happen next, our staff, the very definition of essential workers, showed heroism every day. They stayed dedicated to our mission and ensured the people we serve saw little disruption in the access to food we provide. I am awed by and thankful for their phenomenal capacity in the hardest of times.


