A note from Lindsay

In 2023, The Food Bank for Central & Northeast Missouri launched an innovative new effort that is already changing the landscape of food security in our local communities.

With the opening of The Food Bank Market in November 2023, Boone County neighbors have access to a betterequipped food distribution facility that provides an improved shopping experience that reduces stigma. And, our entire 32-county services area is benefitting from the additional cold storage and freezer space that makes sharing the most nutritious foods – like fresh produce – more possible than ever before.

This good news comes at a time when The Food Bank is seeing new challenges. While we continue to serve 100,000 Missourians each month, in 2023, we served those neighbors around 85,000 more times than we did in 2022. Overall, our network has provided assistance 124,000 more times in the past year than we did each year pre-COVID. In short, with increased prices, it's taking those we serve a little longer to get back on their feet.

For The Food Bank, that means sharing a little extra so our neighbors can achieve food security. Despite more need and our own increased costs, we are proud to have provided the equivalent of more than 22 million meals across our service area.

Thank you for being part of The Food Bank's mission. As you review this report, I hope you see the impact our work has on the community – as well as the good your support does in the dayto-day lives of our neighbors. Your engagement is key to a future without hunger.
